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## Introduction



Welcome to the Enchanted Wheel Oracle deck! This 45-card deck and 128-page book is an offering from the heart. Focused on elemental energies as they relate to the Wheel of the Year in British/Celtic traditions, this oracle offers messages and guidance for personal insights and elemental living. This oracle is based on specific portal days, cardinal directions, elemental wisdom, symbols from nature, and powerful beings found in the consciousness of the British Isles. We have also included guidance from the herbal kingdom and the mythical land of Avalon.

Each card bears a beautiful image accompanied by three keywords. These words can be read as individual messages or become a three-word mantra for the energy at hand. There are eight specific portal days, which you can access through image and your intention. Other cards invoke the presence of goddesses, fairies, mythical creatures, animals, and other symbols that are closely connected to nature and the turning of the seasons.

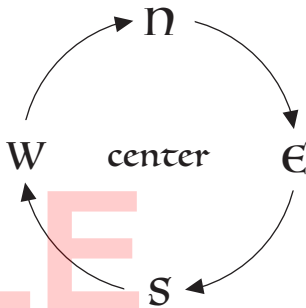
What is elemental living? As we move further into the dawning of the “New Age,” it has become increasingly apparent that our ancestral and shamanic roots are more important than ever. Almost every culture has used the cycles of nature as a timetable for important events and personal survival. Many of our modern holidays and celebrations are rooted in the British/Celtic wheel as it was adapted to serve the people and organized religion. Today, we have the freedom and wisdom to return to these portals at any point in time to access the gifts they offer. In fact, reconnection is what we are realizing is the balm for the modern soul.

The Enchanted Wheel brings the solar events, cardinal and cross-quarter directions into focus as a template for our own navigation. By reacquainting ourselves with the directions, their spirit and energy, we reconnect with our essential nature. This deck is based on the Wheel as it aligns with the seasonal times in the Northern Hemisphere. If you reside in the Southern Hemisphere, you can tune into the energetic quality of the wheel as presented here, or adapt it

to your cycle of seasons. Each card represents a particular time, place, being or energy that has something to share or teach. It is our hope that you will reawaken the part of your soul that connects to this wheel as a guiding light.



## The Wheel of the Year



### The Cardinal Directions and Elements

The directions of East, South, West and North are as important as the four elements of Air, Fire, Water and Earth when we explore the enchanted wheel. In this deck, we followed the directions and elemental associations offered by the goddess teachings found in Glastonbury, UK. In different traditions and cultures, from Eastern philosophy and Chinese medicine

to Western paganism and Native American medicine, the directions and elements have slightly different placements. What is most important is the overall understanding of the direction itself and how the element affects our experience in the world.

Having studied yoga philosophy and other healing systems, I have learned that there is no hard and fast rule regarding the elements and when they appear throughout the year. We are essentially made up of the four elements mentioned and the fifth element, space. Space represents the world, the vast cosmos, the container in which everything else exists.

## Cardinal Directions and Elements

*EAST – SPRING – FIRE*

*SOUTH – SUMMER – WATER*

*WEST – AUTUMN – EARTH*

*NORTH – WINTER – AIR*

*CENTER – ALL YEAR – SPACE AND TIME*

We should also consider the phrase “As Above, So Below” when working with the directions and elements. As Above refers to the higher plane of existence, So Below refers to the deeper foundational place of existence. Finally, the direction we call Center refers to the self and our inner landscape. Finding Center, as we know, is akin to finding peace.



## 21. Dandelion

*ROOTED ≈ PERSISTENCE ≈  
CLEANSING*

Nothing reminds us more of spring growth than the hardy dandelion. Thought of as tenacious weeds by many gardeners,

they are surprisingly resilient and offer healing properties by using

their roots and leaves. Meadow and grass

dwellers, the yellow flower's name honors the sun. When the flowers transform, we have an incredible microcosm encased within the white fluff that remains. Drinking a tea of the roots is a remedy for spring cleansing that is needed as seasons change, and the greens offer a bitter salad as well. All these positive offerings from the once lowly dandelion are enhanced by its persistence to grow despite challenges.

Pulling this card is offering you acknowledgment of your own ability to thrive. Challenges may be everywhere, and the road ahead may not be smooth. Invoke the qualities of this spring herbal to overcome obstacles and to thrive. Persistence is an attribute of so many successful people. Staying strong as the winds of change blow can be what brings you to the next cycle. As you do, remember that the roots of dandelion are what help it to continually grow. This may mean grounding yourself to Mother Earth more deliberately or examining your own roots through family or ancestral connections. Call upon Mother Earth to support you through any transitions.

## 22. South-Summer Solstice-Litha

*MANIFESTATION* ≈  
*BRILLIANCE* ≈ *ACTIVITY*

The great wheel spins South and to the Summer Solstice, which marks the longest day of the year. South represents our entry into adulthood and the active cycle of living, thriving and growth. When we journey toward the Summer Solstice, we have reached the pinnacle of light and are offered longer, more welcoming days to be out in the world. The light present at Summer Solstice allows us to fully see the growth and abundance we have been cultivating. This is the time for bounty and accumulation.

You have chosen this card today as a messenger of personal creation. You may be months away from the Summer Solstice, but it is the gift that you have called to you in the

present moment. Remember, the association of the South is growth. The seed you have planted and have been nurturing will yield what you desire. Remember, manifesting comes in many forms. If you are seeking monetary abundance, be on the lookout for new opportunities to create that financial flow. Manifestation of a love relationship, friendship or new living situation can also be at play. Take some time to think about what you have been putting effort and energy into and be willing to accept what is coming to you currently. As always, be in gratitude for the ability to receive whatever is on the way. The long days of summer help to add fire to the creation process. Use this solstice card energy to illuminate any areas that need additional support or attention.

## 23. Water Element

The water element represents the cup of life, the womb and our mighty bodies of water on the Earth. Not only do we associate water with survival, but it is also essential for our well-being and pleasure. This element represents the sadness of tears and the joy of gestation; indicating that it is truly multi-faceted and aligned with our emotions. Water is a powerful force as we see in the pull of tides, ocean currents, floods and waterfalls. This reminds us of the mighty strength of the water element. Our emotional body is soothed by water—floating, swimming and wading are ways to connect with the element.

By choosing this card, you are being called to tune into your emotional needs and responses. Are they raging like the sea or calm as a still pool? Emotional healing is an important piece of our overall health and wellness. In fact, our mental thoughts and perceptions can create a myriad of emotional responses. This message invites you to take time to get in touch with your emotions. Finding emotional equanimity is key to being a better partner, friend and communicator. Making time to notice what we are feeling is essential to our intuitive growth. If you find that your emotions are way out of balance, make time for self-care and to confide in a trusted friend. The element of water is often seen as “the mother”—connect with your favorite body of water as a gesture of cleansing and renewal.

## 24. Lady of the Lake

CREATION ≈ MAGIC ≈  
LEGEND

The mystical Lady of the Lake is connected to the isle of Avalon and the legends of King Arthur. Thought to live

in a castle under the lake, her powerful presence is felt in Summer

County and through the many years of

stories of the land. The Lady is not generally thought to be just one person as she is a magical enchantress and guardian of the Holy Isle. Some have thought her to be Nimue and others Viviane—who were both priestesses on the Holy Isle. The Lady can manipulate water by summoning rain, stir the waters into a storm and make the lake's surface either hard enough to walk upon or become shrouded in mist. Her most powerful act was to present the sword Excalibur

to King Arthur from the depths of her lake. True magic was the manifestation of the sword of truth.

Lady of the Lake surfaces for you in this message to remind you about magic! Your personal power and magnetism are being called to the forefront today. What needs a bit of magical energy in your life? Have you forgotten that you are a powerful force in your personal world? Sometimes, we need to be reminded that our skills and talents are of great value. Magic is a quality that requires our presence and willingness to take a leap of faith. The Lady of the Lake swims in the emotional waters to remind us that true power and magic arise from the inner quest. ## 25. Chalice Well

SANCTUARY ≈ PEACE ≈  
STILLNESS

Chalice Well is a powerful portal of the divine feminine.

Located in a garden beneath the Tor in Glastonbury, it symbolizes

the mother waters of the red spring and the place where drops

of blood from the Holy Grail of Christ were

sprinkled by Joseph of Arimathea. The well is considered a sanctuary of feminine wisdom, and the healing waters can

be taken from the fountain of the Lion's head. The design of the well cover, called Vesica Piscis, is a sacred geometric

symbol found at the site and is often decorated by visitors and pilgrims. The circumference of one circle goes through

the center of another identical circle, and in the center is the Vesica, representing the portal between two worlds.

The Chalice Well is welcoming you now for a much-needed respite. Take refuge in the energy of this card, which is offering unconditional love, peace, quiet and a break from the demands of the outer world. The two worlds that meet here in the gardens offer a bridge to the place of rest and contemplation. The red spring represents the feminine waters of receptivity. This message encourages taking a deliberate break—whether that is a day to rest, journal, practice self-care at home or visit a sanctuary place.

Choose something that feels nourishing and undemanding. In a busy world, we can lose sight of our need to step away—even for a short time. If possible, create a home sanctuary by dedicating a special space for you to renew your energy. Fill that space with your favorite crystals, candles, pictures and objects. Dedicate time and space to yourself regularly as a deserving being of light.
